## **SPOTLIGHT:** Persecuted (or Paranoid) at Work Feeling ignored at work? Denied a raise without reason? Are you the target of derogatory comments? The General Social Survey, one of the best sociological measurement tools, asked these and similar questions for the first time in its 40year history. On several fronts, conservative Christians reported significantly higher rates of workplace woes, whether measured by church affiliation (which is how most researchers measure "evangelicals") or by activity (e.g., having had "a 'born-again' experience"). On the plus side, they're more likely to say they're very satisfied with their job. (ve been treated rudely at work Born-again Christians are 79 percent more likely than others to say they're often or sometimes the butt of jokes or derogatory comments. What did you do about it? "Born-agains" are more likely to confront the person engaging in the behavior than nonbornagain Americans as a whole. But members of Evangelicals and non-Christian religions are significantly more likely to confront offenders than members of any born-agains are nearly twice as likely Christian group (or than "nones").
